- 4. Inter Counties championships:

5. County closed:

Open age: Won by James Peach. No report due to enforced absence of Marc Thomas, but full details on website.

Juniors: Event attracted 60 entries for all age groups from U11 to U19. All results can be found on the website. The 2014/15 event will be held at Pontefract on 27th/28th September, 2014 and all inter county squads will be required to enter.

Masters: No reports. The 2014/15 events will be held on the weekend of 4th/5th October, 2014, and will be organised by Nick Green (O35), Nick Wall (O40/O45), Steve Blacksell (O50/O55) and Martin Day (O60/O65).

Racketball: Results of closed competition already circulated. In the inter-club competition, Chapel Allerton beat Huddersfield in the Men's Open, Huddersfield beat CA in the O50 and CA Ladies had a walk-over against Hallamshire.

- 6. Yorkshire League: 2013/14 results as per website. Trophies presented to Barnsley (Premier), Pontefract 2 (Division 1) and Wigginton (division 2). New entries for 2014/15 received from North Ferriby and Hull and East Riding. Application from Grimsby was rejected.
